1. Aglands Preservation Program

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Funding is requested for the Agricultural Lands Preservation Program. Including Fiscal Year 2014 funding, the foundation has permanently protected 115,000 acres at a cost of over \$206 million using a combination of state, federal and county funds. Additionally, landowners over the life of the program have donated over \$262 million to the foundation - representing a discount of 55 percent of the value of their easements. Interest among landowners has not diminished. In the most recent round of easement selections (Round 18), 113 properties were appraised, 71 owners submitted offers and 44 were selected. This request provides sufficient funding to match federal and county contributions, purchase easements on properties that do not qualify for federal funds and operate the program.

2. Young Farmers Loan Program

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Funding is requested to continue the Young Farmers Loan Program. The funding will help young men and women establish agricultural operations by providing zero-interest loans to assist with the purchase of farmland. Specifically, the program will provide up to 70 percent of the value of the development rights and in return, the State receives a permanent conservation easement on the farm under the parameters and management of the Agricultural Lands Preservation Program. The young farmer repays the loan at no interest over a 30-year term, which helps to replenish the fund. The recipient must maintain an active farming operation on the property over the life of the loan. If the recipient withdraws from the program or sells the property, then he or she must repay the balance of the loan in full, but the conservation easement is perpetual regardless of property ownership. Including Fiscal Year 2014 funding, the Young Farmers Loan Program has provided 25 loans totaling over \$6 million and helped these recipients purchase farms totaling over 2,100 acres.

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3. Kjeldahl Instrument

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Funding is requested to purchase a Kjeldahl Instrument in the Agriculture Compliance Laboratory. This instrument performs analysis on manure, testing for nitrogen and ammonia. The testing is required for farmers to comply with Nutrient Management laws. The new instrument will be automated, saving analysis and monitoring time of employees for the tests. Additionally, the new instrument will be digital, making it compatible with the new Laboratory Information Management System that was installed during Fiscal Year 2015.
